Patterns of undergraduate checkout activity may be seen as an indicators of when students are most typically involved in active study and research. The value of library initiatives to serve undergraduates may be enhanced by timing them to correspond with these patterns. The data below was gathered over two academic years, and includes regular and course reserve initial checkouts by undergraduates; renewals are not included.

First year students checkout relatively few items during their first semester. In the second semester checkouts increase. Checkouts plateau during the second and third years, and then increase again during senior year.
