
FAQ about Brown Parking: Parking for Campus Visitors DRAFT for general USE updated 6-Apr-17

Parking is at a premium around Brown University. The City of Providence has metered street parking that may be available for up to three hours' maximum -- no "feeding the meter". After three hours you <u>must</u> move your car to another location.

Most days, if you arrive before 9AM, you should be able to park in front of Brown's largest library, The Rockefeller Library @10 Prospect Street—shown below as the **red** triangle in the map:



Rockefeller Library, known locally as "The Rock" is Brown's main holdings library. There are parking meters in front of the library entrance on Prospect street. Please be aware that the parking limit is 3 hours max., *no feeding the meter*; and some of the meters only accept quarters, so come prepared! Parking enforcement is VERY strict. Here is a link to an <u>FAQ</u> of regulations imposed by the city of Providence. Credit cards *may* be accepted – see the faq - but to be safe bring quarters.

If you don't find a metered space in front of the Rock, or if you plan to be here more than three hours, your other parking option is the **Power Street Visitors** garage. I've used a yellow triangle to show you an approximate location. Here is a helpful link about the arage:



Parking at the garage, for a full day, is approximately \$15.00. The plus side of the garage is that Power Street reliably takes credit cards and parking can be purchased for a full-day or for an hourly block of time; you won't have to worry about moving your car after three hours to avoid a ticket.

I've marked other Brown Libraries (on campus) as well as the Rock. The Sciences Library, known locally as "SciLi", houses the Science collection stacks and the digital technology staff. I've used a blue circle to show its approximate location on the map. Orwig Music Library is represented by a purple square, and the Hay Library (Special Collections) is located next to the Rock is an orange circle.

To give you a sense of walking scale: The Power Street garage is .5 miles from the Rock, and the SciLi is also .5 miles from Rock: roughly an isosceles triangle if the points were connected.

For guests traveling by Metro or bus, the pink star -- on the far left side of the map -- is the bus plaza/rail station area in downtown Providence. Guests will need to walk up the hill (past RISD and the state rotunda) to reach the Rock. The walk is approximately .5 miles.
